LOGLINE

SHORT SYNOPSIS

As the world rages in war and civil strife, CIA agent Carmen Reese arrives at a secret underground prison to interrogate a time-traveling terrorist who is responsible for the unfolding catastrophe. Her immediate task is to investigate the mysterious death of her predecessor - a talented interrogator and former lover. Was it suicide as the evidence suggests? Or was it murder? Carmen knows that the answers to these questions are linked to bigger, more important questions: Is the prisoner who he claims to be? And what is his real agenda? It's now a race against the clock as Carmen and the prisoner engage in a battle of wills to see whose version of the future will triumph.

SYNOPSIS

On a cold January night, a young man is found unconscious at the wheel of her car not far from the Canadian border. A lump of weapons-grade Uranium is recovered from the trunk. He is soon thrown into a high-security prison and tortured relentlessly. But apart from a few vicious-sounding curses, he utters nothing.

Then one day, unprompted, the prisoner provides an alphanumeric list of upcoming Supernova explosions. The very next day the first of those celestial events occurs exactly as predicted, sending shockwaves through the security establishment. It's obvious; the man in custody is no ordinary terrorist. He is a time-traveller from the future!

Fifteen years later, Ramiro remains in 'Sandbox' prison deep underground - but much has changed in the world above. Based on his ongoing Intel, the US has waged a relentless war on terror in an attempt to neutralize the remaining 98 "temporal jihadists" he claims to have arrived with him. Still, and despite all efforts, the remaining terrorists and their enigmatic leader, 'Abraham', remain at large.

Such are the state of affairs the day CIA agent Carmen Reese arrives on site. Her immediate task is to investigate the mysterious death of her predecessor - a talented interrogator and former lover. Was it suicide as the evidence suggests? Or was it murder? Carmen knows that the answers to these questions are linked to bigger, more important questions: Is Ramiro who he claims to be? GAURAV SETH - WRITER/DIRECTOR





DIRECTOR'S NOTES

PRISONER X belongs to a rare breed of science fiction; it is a perfect blend of high-concept and solid character drama. At the core of the story is a fascinating premise that serves as an ideal launch pad for a gripping, heart-racing thriller that speaks directly to today's savvy and film literate audience. It's the kind of science fiction that has proven exceptionally successful in recent years. Films like INCEPTION and SOURCE CODE come to mind. That's why I'm confident PRISONER X will be a sure winner. It has the mystery and enigma of TWILIGHT ZONE and the riveting, suspenseful plot of THE USUAL SUSPECTS.

The enigmatic character of Ramiro is the driving force behind this thriller. Charming, mysterious, intelligent and exceptionally dangerous, he is the perfect antagonist. There's so little about him that we know, and the things that we do discover during the course of the story only raise new, even more frightening, questions. Already hooked by Ramiro's compelling defiance of the norms of human endurance, our interest is further peaked by the second pillar of the story - Carmen. Tough, smart and driven, Carmen proves to be a formidable opponent in the psychological tug-of-war that forms the heart of this story. But the thing that makes her even more compelling and sympathetic is the personal resonance that this struggle takes on for her. Carmen's back story will be developed further, giving the audience an insight into her inner world - her hidden motivations and emotional vulnerabilities, vulnerabilities that Ramiro will exploit. This will make the climax, in which Carmen tricks Ramiro into revealing the truth and killing himself, even more satisfying.

Another exciting aspect of PRISONER X is its setting. The secret underground prison feels like a living character, an active participant in the unfolding events, and the visual treatment of the film will further enhance its impact on the story. The dark, snaking tunnels and fortified bunker-like cells will serve as an effective metaphor for Ramiro's mysterious and treacherous mind, which Carmen has to penetrate in order to expose his secret. A fiercely-guarded secret, much like Ramiro himself is.

As a good thriller does, PRSIONER X holds our attention by withholding information, by revealing crucial details bit by bit, gradually raising the stakes in the process. And it often gives us reason to doubt what has been revealed, giving rise to unease that heightens the tension even more. The visual narrative of PRISONER X will help actualize this. The drama will flow seamlessly from the brooding tension of the underground prison, established by dramatic lighting and textural production design, and the cataclysmic events unfolding on the surface above.

DIRECTOR'S NOTES

An image system of distorted perspectives will be weaved throughout the film - deformed reflections in glass and metal surfaces, ever-present shadows, unconventional points of view - these images, unconsciously seeping into the minds of the viewers, will create a persistent sense of fear and keep them riveted to the edge of their seats. Creeping camera movements will build towards chilling moments of suspense. Hand-held portraits will breathe with tension. Floating steadicam will follow characters down dark, snaking tunnels. A skillful use of mis-en-scene with dynamic camera movements and editing within the take will complement the briskly developing plot. And a deliciously chilling soundtrack will further ratchet up the tension as we watch the fate of the world play out on screen.

All movies strive to entertain, but ones that provide the audience with a meaningful emotional experience as well, an experience that tends to linger in their memories, are the rare ones. My goal is make PRISONER X the best of those. Nothing less.

HIGH CONCEPT, LOW BUDGET

When a script involves Time Machines and Nuclear Holocausts, one understandably assumes that considerable resources will be required to take it to screen. After all, we live in an age of CGI-dominated movies with obscenely high budgets. But the genius of PRISONER X, to put it immodestly, lies in the fact that it is a high concept sci-fi thriller which was produced for an astonishingly low budget. Much like Vincenzo Natali's CUBE and Darren Aronofsky's PI - two tremendously successful movies of the same genre.

To begin with, about eighty percent of PRSIONER X takes place in one location - the secret underground prison sandbox. And with the heart of the drama limited to four main characters, budgetary demands were greatly reduced. But more importantly, the elements in the movie that have the greatest psychological impact - namely, the futuristic time travel technology and the unfolding global catastrophe - will require only a fraction of the resources than one might usually expect. For PRISONER X will be a unique film. It will tell a science fiction story without special effects; it will portray nuclear war without a single explosion. But in no way will this dilute the impact of its storytelling. On the contrary, these cinematic devices will enhance its effectiveness.

After all, the suggestion of a monster lurking in the shadows is often more frightening than the sight of the monster itself.

THE NEAR-FUTURE THE STATE OF THE WORLD IN 2017

Science Fiction is a genre of endless possibilities. Stories can be set in alien worlds and fantastical times, depicting extraordinary characters and incredible situations. Anything and everything can be made possible to capture the audience's imagination. However, science fiction doesn't necessarily have to be overly fantastical in order to be successful. A fictional premise grounded in reality and unfolding in a familiar setting can be equally thrilling and entertaining. PRISONER X takes this approach.

The story begins with Ramiro's capture a few months after the attacks of September 11, 2001, after which we fast-forward fifteen years to the year 2017 and find ourselves in a world that's familiar, yet tragically different. Giving real events of the past decade a fantastical twist, PRISONER X cleverly suggests that the US war on terror was actually motivated by the information Ramiro provided during his interrogations. It had nothing to do with Al Qaeda and WMDs. The US was in fact engaged in a desperate hunt for a group of ninety-eight timetraveling jihadists who Ramiro claims arrived with him. That was the real reason behind the invasions of Afghanistan and Iraq and the sudden eruption of popular revolutions in Tunisia, Egypt, Libya, Syria - the so-called Arab Spring- which the movie suggests were actually orchestrated by the CIA.

Developing this alternate history further, PRISONER X reveals that the US didn't stop there. In 2015 it invaded the remaining countries in the Middle-East and essentially wiped Pakistan off the map. But the terrorists led by their enigmatic leader Abraham have continued to evade capture. So when a strange, futuristic device is found in rubble of a massive explosion in Mumbai, raising the possibility of Abraham's presence there, a paranoid US President orders his military to prepare for a full-scale invasion of India.

Not surprisingly, the impact of the numerous wars overseas is also being felt at home. A major terrorist attack on a nuclear power plant near New York City has taken thousands of lives. Millions have been left homeless and a large swath of the North-East has been rendered uninhabitable for decades. Power shortages have crippled the economy and civil unrest has broken out in several states. For the first time in history tanks and armored vehicles roam the streets of US cities.

Such are the state of affairs the day CIA agent Carmen Reece arrives at the secret underground prison codenamed Sandbox. Her immediate task is to investigate the death of her predecessor. But she is also determined to solve the mystery of Ramiro, who she believes is responsible for the catastrophe unfolding on the surface above.
